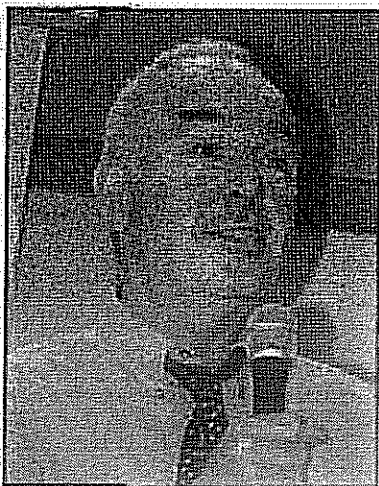


'For fox sake'

South African Collieries Human Resources Association (SACHRA) hosted a brunch seminar at the Witbank Protea Hotel with Clem Sunter giving a presentation on 'The World and SA in the 2010's'. Exxaro Arnot Coal co-hosted the event that took place on November 16. The guest speaker at the event was Clem Sunter.

Retired chairman of the Anglo American Chairman's Fund, renowned South African scenario planner and futurologist Mr Sunter was born in Suffolk, England on August 8, 1944.

In 1971, he moved to Lusaka in Zambia to work for the Anglo American Corporation Central Africa. From there he was trans-

ferred in 1973 to the head office of Anglo American Corporation of South Africa in Johannesburg. He spent most of his subsequent career in the Gold and Uranium Division, serving as its chairman and chief executive officer from 1990 to 1996. He has now retired as the chairman of the Anglo American Chairman's Fund.

Since 1987, he has written 14 books some of which have been bestsellers. His other main interest is seeking to mobilise the private sector in the war against HIV/AIDS.

'Games Foxes Play' is a follow-up and a fine-tuning of the authors' number-one bestseller 'The Mind of a Fox', published in June 2001. 'The Mind of a Fox' put scenario planning back on the map and in the boardroom (co-author, Chantell Ilbury).

'Games Foxes Play' has taken the basic principles further, challenging the American hedgehog view that only leaders with a fixed, central vision can achieve greatness. Sunter and Ilbury favour foxes, leaders with a balanced set of beliefs and the ability to adapt to change.

One of the most appealing aspects of this business book and his seminar is that it doesn't read and feel like a business book. You don't get lost in confusing business jargon, which allows you to concentrate and enjoy the message.
